Philippe Aghion is Robert C. Waggoner Professor of Economics at Harvard University. He received his Ph.D. at Harvard University in 1987, later teaching at MIT, Oxford and the University College London before returning to Harvard in 2000. He is a co-founder of the Center for Research and for Graduate Education in Prague, and the CEPR Program Director in Industrial Organization. His research interests are in the areas of economic growth, economic development and industrial organization in which he has published more than 70 articles in general and specialized economic journals. He is the founder and editor of the journal *The Economics of Transition*, and serves on several editorial boards including *Econometrica* and the *Review of Economic Studies*. Among his books are *Endogenous Growth Theory* (1998, MIT Press), *Inequality, Growth and Globalization: Theory, History and Policy* (1999, Cambridge University Press), *Competition and Innovation* (2005, MIT Press). During the past five years, Philippe Aghion has explored the theoretical and empirical links among economic growth, contract theory, market structure and economic institutions.
