## The Thirteenth Annual Huber Hurst Research Seminar

The business law and legal studies group at Boston College and the University of Florida invite you to consider participating in the Thirteenth Annual Huber Hurst Research Seminar to be held at Boston College in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts, February 13-14, 2009.

What is it? We will invite 9 business law/legal studies scholars to take part in an intensive research seminar. Participants will commit to submitting their research papers to us on or before Tuesday, January 6, 2009, presenting the paper for discussion and analysis, receiving and reading each paper in advance, attending and participating in all sessions, and mentioning the Seminar in the footnotes of published papers presented at the Hurst Seminar. Our goal is to help stimulate high quality research and publication in our discipline by providing an unusual opportunity for sustained in-depth attention to research.

What kind of research papers? The paper should be a major piece of legal research intended for publication in the *ABLJ* or an other major law review/journal. We welcome all business-law-related topics. Your paper should be in a research format accessible to a legal audience. It should not yet be published, but it should be in polished draft form so that it can benefit from comment and discussion. It can be accepted for publication but still be in the revision/editing stage, and it may have been presented at ALSB or regional or other professional meetings. Co-authored papers may be submitted but only one author can attend. Please identify the author who will present at the Seminar.

What is involved? Participants provide their own transportation to Boston (although we might be able to provide limited travel help if you cannot otherwise come). The University of Florida will provide room, and Boston College will provide meals and hospitality. The meeting will begin with dinner on Thursday, February 12, 2009 and end by 5:30 p.m. Saturday, February 14, 2009. Participants may arrive on Wednesday evening and/or stay over Saturday night as our guests if they wish. Spouses and friends are welcome to come to Boston and to participate in dinners and social events. We have no special activities planned for your guests, but there are many historical and cultural attractions in the greater Boston area.

How does one participate? Please send a brief abstract of the paper you propose to give together with a current résumé, to
