

Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration **Area of Specialization: *Family, Youth and Community Sciences (FYC)***

Description

This interdisciplinary area of specialization in applied social science prepares students for careers in professions that strengthen families, children and youth and communities. This includes family life education, youth development, human services, community development and extension education. Students receive the training needed to understand and help youth, families and communities by taking foundation courses in sociology, psychology and economics; advanced courses in youth, family and community development and issues; and specialized courses emphasizing critical prevention and intervention skills.
