The Center for Latin American Studies at the University of Florida was founded in 1930. It is the oldest such center in the country and remains a premier institution. The Center offers interdisciplinary teaching and research programs focused on Latin America and the Caribbean. Students can draw upon 20 Center-based faculty members and more than 160 faculty affiliates at UF who teach courses and carry out research on Latin America and the Caribbean. Requirements

Students are required to have a minimum of four classes totaling 12 hours from any of the 3000-4000 level courses listed below and maintain a minimum 2.0 Area of Specialization GPA. Be sure to check course prerequisite requirements.

[LAS 4935](#) Undergraduate Seminar in Latin American Studies (Different topic areas are presented each semester. Students may repeat LAS 4935 for an additional 6 credit hours if the topics vary).

Any other courses must have Latin America content and be approved by the Center for Latin American Studies prior to beginning the course, a course substitution form then must be submitted to 267 Stuzin Hall. Consult the Latin American Studies course guides posted on the Center's website.
