

## **Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration** **Area of Specialization: *Sustainability Studies (SUS)***

### ***Description***

The Sustainability Studies area of specialization is characterized by three overarching concerns: maintaining ecological and environmental health; creating economic welfare; and ensuring social justice. The aim of the area of specialization in Sustainability Studies is to help students understand the ways in which these three concerns are interrelated and to explore how they best can be pursued at local, national, and global scales.

### ***Requirements***

Students are required to complete the gateway course AND a minimum of four additional classes totaling 12 hours from the 3000-4000 level courses listed below and maintain a minimum 2.0 Area of Specialization GPA. Be sure to check course prerequisite requirements.

- A gateway course, “Facets of Sustainability” (IDS 2154), introduces all students to the theory, principles, and practices of sustainability as approached through a variety of topical concerns and academic fields. It is offered each fall.
- Students subsequently select 4 courses from a menu that spans multiple disciplines to gain a broad exposure to sustainability-related curricula. Students must complete one course from each Cluster for the area of specialization.
