#### Germany

The Federal Republic of Germany is located in the heart of Europe. #### Courses

The range of courses offered to exchange students includes a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Master of Science in Management Program as well as a full-time MBA Program. 80 % percent of the courses in the undergraduate program and 100% of the courses in the graduate programs are taught in English.
