Description

This specialization is designed to provide opportunities for undergraduate students in all majors to enhance their knowledge of disabilities and the impact disabilities have on the lives of people who experience them, and on the people with whom they live and interact. The focus is on the understanding of types of disabilities, how disabilities are perceived in society, ways people with disabilities are included in recreational, leisure, employment, educational, and other community activities, and legal aspects of disability policies.
